




## Members Leaving the Church

Inter-American Division (IAD)




## Members Leaving the Church as a Percentage of Division Membership



- To hold seminars in conflict resolutions
- To conduct conferences or Summits on nurture and retention
- To use small-group approach and other programs for discipling and retaining members, etc.




My local church offers training on nurture and discipling of church members.



## What kind of people leave our churches?

- 1. Men & Women: 41%:59% (F&IM); 52%:48% (LS)
- 2. Those who were raised Adventists or came through friends, public campaigns or other methods.
- 3. Very well or well prepared (57%). 48% spent several years attending the SDA church before baptism (3 or more years) (F&IM)

4. Those who used to attend the church for a short or long period of time after baptism



#### Age When they Stopped Attending the Adventist Church (F&IM) 18-29 30-39 40 +



Primary triggers: What was happening in the local congregation and in their families: atmosphere, climate in the church, relationships, and support. (LS)




### **Secondary Triggers for Departure**






# Inter-American Division Church Member Survey Report 2018


- "The spiritual growth of the participants in the last 12 months has been analyzed with the scale (1. It is not true for me, 2. I am not sure, 3. It is very true), the participants stated the following: 60% have grown spiritually with, 33% said they are not sure if they have grown spiritually and 7% said they had not had spiritual growth in the last year." (IAD CMS Report, p. 17)
- "A very important issue in society is anger and bitterness that is why 60% of the participants have said that they try to avoid them, to have a better coexistence and harmony in their environment. While 12% have problems in their interpersonal relationships and 28% are not sure to avoid the anger and bitterness itself." (IAD CMS Report, p. 17)




## Life events in the year leading up to decision to stop attending the church $_{\mbox{\tiny (F\&IM)}}$




#### Life Events (F&IM)

What originally brought you to this congregation, what originally attracted you to attend this congregation? (SAD CMS - 2013)





### What attracts young people to the church? (21st CCS)




### To remain Adventist for the next 20 years (Valuegenesis Europe)


- 8 times more likely if preaching is relevant






### Young people: alcohol and tobacco usage in the last 12 months



Health message beliefs: the Health Message has largely been supported by scientific discoveries.




















# Family Worships: have morning or evening worships with members of my family



### Church and SS Attendance Help with Church ministry: every week or more than once a week



Involvement in service with non-Adventists in a local community: every week or more than once a week (2018- total: never: 16%-15%-18%)




Effect of personal religion: although I am religious, it does not affect my daily life








### What Happened When They Stopped Attending Church (F&IM)


#### 40% No one contacted me

- 19% A church member came to visit me
- 17% A local elder came to visit me
- 15% A local church member contacted me by phone
- 10% An Adventist relative made contact
- 9% The pastor came to visit me
- 6% The pastor contacted me by phone or Email
- 3% An Adventist, not a local member contacted me
- 2% I received a letter in the mail
- 0.3% Printed material was mailed to me


#### Who Attempted to Reconnect: 66% - family, friends, church members (LS)



Openness to Reconnect (those who left the church) (LS) (57% + 19% = 76%)



Openness to Reconnect (combined responses of those who left the church and of those who returned) (LS) (64% +17%=81%)



#### Retention surveys: Reasons why people decide to leave the Adventist church (LS)

Reasons cited by those who left	Reasons cited by those who returned
30 – lack of discipleship and involvement	37 - lack of discipleship
27 - lack of support	30 - lack of friends
24 - lack of friends	29 - lack of support and visitation
23 - interpersonal conflicts	22 - separation from God
22 - lack of love	19 - lack of involvement
20 - hypocrisy	18 - lack of love (especially leaders)
19 - worldly things	17 - worldly things
18 - work	16 - interpersonal conflicts
17 - doctrinal issues	16 - hypocrisy
11 - lack of faith	13 - incomplete conversion
9 - family problems and pressure	12 - lack of faith
7 - boredom	10 - focus on human examples

## Summary

> The primary reason of people leaving the church is not doctrinal

Climate, atmosphere, relationships, support, and worship in the local church are crucial What is happening in personal and spiritual lives of people are also crucial

Need for effective support and follow-up system(s) in the local church after baptism and after people dropped - Visitations, personal contacts, and time spent with those who left the church plays a crucial role -

## Key issues:

- Perceived hypocrisy
- Marital difficulties and conflicts
- >Lack of friends in the church
- Different types of conflicts
- Church climate & support system (visitation)
- Worship & preaching
- >Age at baptism & young people (especially up to 20 years old)
- Discipleship programs
- Personal devotional life
- Church attendance
- Involvement in church ministries and witnessing

## Solutions

- 1) Discipleship of church members (new and old, youth and young adults)
- Solid preparation before baptism
- Discipleship program after baptism which should enable church members to:
- ✓ Create meaningful devotional life and close relationships with Jesus
- ✓ Be rooted in the Scripture and Adventist doctrines
- ✓ Be active attenders of church worships and Sabbath School
- Discover their spiritual gifts and be involved in respective church ministries
- ✓ Become a friendly witness

## Solutions

2) Each local church should become an attractive place for church members, young people, and visitors to belong to:

- >Warm, safe, and friendly atmosphere
- Inspiring worship & relevant preaching
- ➤Intellectual climate
- Social events outside of worship


Member care & support ministries: pastoral visitation, small groups, and prayer ministries

# Solutions

### 3) Reclaiming

- Nurture & Retention Coordinators on all levels
- Inactive and former member ministry Plans
- ➢ Regular membership audit
- Contacts with missing members
- >Involvement of inactive members in Discipleship program
- Regular events of reclaiming of former, inactive, and missing members
