TEAM

Team members (I) operate with a high degree of **interdependence**, (2) **share** authority and responsibility for self-management, (3) are accountable for the **collective** performance, and (4) work toward a **common goal** and shared rewards(s).

A team becomes more than just a collection of people when a strong sense of **mutual commitment** creates synergy, thus generating performance greater than the sum of the performance of its individual members.
